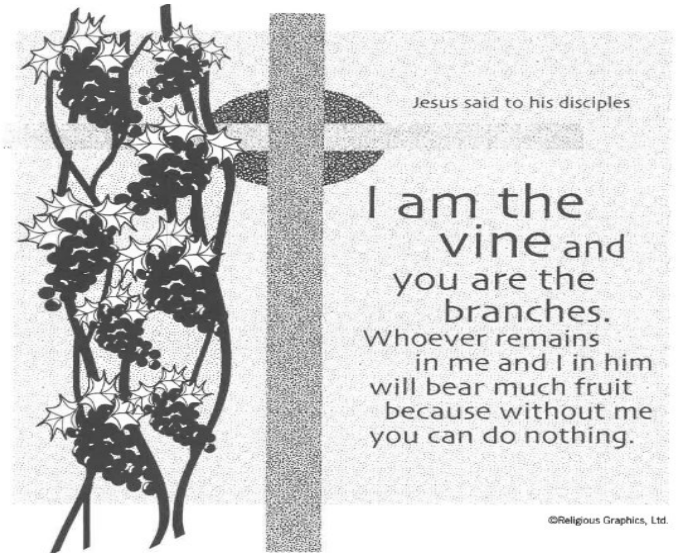

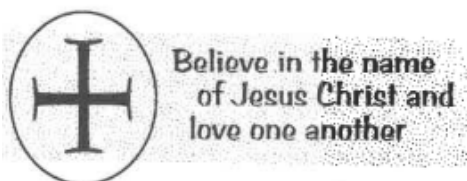

In the Liturgy of the Church Helen Ackermann

We have a vineyard; a very small vineyard, but it does produce grapes, which can then be made into delicious wine. In keeping a vineyard, it is necessary to do some pruning. Each spring, my husband prunes some of the branches so that the others that remain can draw more strength from the vine. This pruning needs to take place.

When we read the gospel for his Sunday from the community of John, we hear that Jesus refers to himself as the vine and that God is the vine grower. What can this pruning mean in our lives? If we are to bear good fruit, we need to be pruned of our weaknesses. In that way we can bear much good fruit. Even those branches that remain need some pruning so that they may grow stronger. It is all about being firmly attached to the person of Jesus Christ. Only Jesus can give us the strength to bear good fruit.

In the gospel, we hear the words, "Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you remain in me. I am the vine and you are the branches." The next question we need to ask ourselves is what is the good fruit we are to bear? Good fruit leads us to living in the way of Jesus Christ. It involves loving others as Jesus loved others. It means seeking justice for all those who are deprived of justice. It means helping others see the goodness of God and believing in their own goodness. It means being connected to others. Being connected to Jesus Christ speaks of relationship with him. We love God through Jesus Christ as we hold tightly to him as our vine. He is indeed the way, the truth and the life.

We remember this week, Catherine of Siena, virgin, doctor of the Church, (Monday) Pius V, pope, (Tuesday) Joseph the Worker (Wednesday) Athanasius, Bishop, doctor of the Church (Thursday) Philip and James, apostles, (Friday)

St. Catherine of Sienna, doctor of the Church (1347-1380)

Catherine of Siena is one of a few women who were called doctors of the Church. The term doctor refers to a great teacher in the Church. She was the 23 child in her family. It was a time when girls were told who they would marry and where they would live. Catherine convinced her parents that she should not marry. She took a job in her own home acting as a maid. She became a member of the Third Order of St. Dominic. While living at home, she prayed, cared for the sick and visited people in prison. She gained a reputation of being very wise. Priests, politicians, and nobles came to here for guidance. It was a time of unrest in the Church. More than one person claimed to be pope. She worked in Rome to bring unity. In her lifetime she wrote over 400 letters and a book.

SCRIPTURE TEXTS - May 5, 2024:

Sixth Sunday of Easter

Opening Prayer: Lord God, assist me to know that the greatest commandment is to love one another. Fill my heart with a desire to love as Jesus loved. When I do I will find joy and recognize that he is my friend. I make this prayer in his name, he who is Lord forever and ever. Amen.

ACTS 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

When Peter entered, Cornelius met him and, falling at his feet, paid him homage. Peter, however, raised him up, saying, "Get up. I myself am also a human being."

Then Peter proceeded to speak and said, "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him."

While Peter was still speaking these things, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word. The circumcised believers who had accompanied Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit should have been poured out on the Gentiles also, for they could hear them speaking in tongues and glorifying God. Then Peter responded, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit even as we have?" He ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.

him. In this is love: not that we have loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as expiation for our sins.

JOHN 15:9-17

Jesus said to his disciples: "As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love.

"I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete. This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father. It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name he may give you. This I command you: love one another."

Reflection Questions:

1. Do you believe that God loves you unconditionally? Do you need to prove anything to gain God's love.?
2. Jesus calls us his friends. Do you feel that Jesus is your friend?
3. What does it mean to love one another as Jesus loves?

Concluding Prayer: Lord God, help me to love as I should with the same love that you have revealed to me through your son, Jesus Christ. I make this prayer in his name, he who is Lord forever and ever. Amen
